## Lesson 1

• Pin the text for the week up on a wall/cupboard/door where the whole family can see it. Read it together daily.


Also help your child to read it by him/herself. Younger ones maybe able to recognise some words, like 'and', 'I', 'of', 'as' and sound out 'for the Lord God.'

- Younger children can colour in our Hallelujah/Alleluia outlines.
- Older children can write answers to the questions, or give verbal answers.

Writing is good if the child can be encouraged to do so as it will practice his/her writing skills.

Focus on the correct answer, and give help with spelling as it is needed. Do encourage neat work.
